 - b. Discussion
 - i. Purpose: To put events and date out to the community and to bring families back into the school
 - ii. Interest in Back to School Night including students and families where the focus is on welcoming back to school. More like a carnival celebration back into school. Have seen lots of success with Swansea with their back to school carnivals.
 - iii. Would like to see families welcome into culture days consider how to include the families' home culture.

- iv. Are identifying ways to increase our collaborative events with Swansea. Anai will be collaborating with the parent liaison from Swansea which should be able to support families who have students at both schools. Ex. Trick or Trunk this past year great event with strong family engagement.
- v. Feedback: consider combining parent events for example in October, there are three events for families. Can those be combined so that a family can attend conferences, attend the Edgenuity informational meeting, and attend a graduation meeting? Families share that getting the information in advance is important and helps with planning, and will prioritize, but see positives in combining events for busy parents.
- vi. Feedback: Appreciate how the calendar honors a variety of cultures within our community, and it is important that the celebrations are appropriate and honoring each culture and avoid cultural appropriation. Agreement, and this is also an opportunity for our entire community to learn more about other cultures, and this is an opportunity for families to get involved in the school activities.
- vii. Feedback: would like to see a school-based culture team Hedrick would like to be a part of this and support the work on the culture calendar in the future.
- viii. Feedback: Let's get the CSC meetings on the culture calendar too!
- ix. Question: what does planning for back to school look like? Anai wants to sit down with teachers to get feedback on what this can look like. Still working on next steps to make events happen. Hedrick would like to be involved.
- x. Next Steps for the culture calendar:
 - 1. Take it to the SLT for feedback in the future
 - 2. Remember that gaining feedback following events from stakeholders in attendance is critical, and that the calendar should be adjusted according to that feedback. The calendar should be a working document.
 - 3. There is interest in including English and Spanish classes for the community. We have teachers who have expressed interest here. The next CSC can look to utilizing some of the Title 1 Parent Engagement funds to support this effort.
